Freedom of Information Publication scheme

1. Introduction: what a publication scheme is and why it has been developed

One of the aims of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (which is referred to as FOIA in the rest of this document) is that public authorities, including all maintained schools, should be clear and proactive about the information they will make public.

To do this we must produce a publication scheme, setting out:

- The classes of information which we publish or intend to publish;
- The manner in which the information will be published; and
- Whether the information is available free of charge or on payment.

The scheme covers information already published and information which is to be published in the future. Some information which we hold may not be made public, for example personal information. This publication scheme conforms to the model scheme for schools approved by the Information Commissioner.

2. Aims and Objectives

At Noremarsch School we believe that for the children to reach their full potential there needs to be a partnership between parents, children and the staff of Noremarsch. All parties have an important role to play and these are detailed below.

- Our aims for teaching and learning are that all pupils will:
- Be given an equal opportunity to reach their full potential academically and socially.
- Have their awareness of moral and spiritual values continually raised.
- Be encouraged to become independent learners equipped with the necessary skills for life.
- Be encouraged to have understanding, tolerance and a respect for the needs of others that can be shown through thoughts and deeds.
- Be able to demonstrate an increasing respect for their own and others possessions, developing an increasing appreciation and concern for their immediate and the wider environment.

All members of the school community work towards these aims.

3. Categories of information published

The publication scheme guides you to information which we currently publish (or have recently published) or which we will publish in the future. This is split into categories of information known as 'classes'. These are contained in section 6 of this scheme.

The classes of information that we undertake to make available are organised into four broad topic areas:

- School Prospectus – information published in the school prospectus.
- Governors' Documents – information published in the Governors Annual Report and in other governing body documents.
- Pupils & Curriculum – information about policies that relate to pupils and the school curriculum.
- School Policies and other information related to the school - information about policies that relate to the school in general.

Governors' Annual Report	<p>The statutory contents of the governors' annual report to parents are as follows, (other items may be included at the school's discretion):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • details of the governing body membership, including name and address of chair and clerk. • a statement on progress in implementing the action plan drawn up following an inspection. • a financial statement, including gifts made to the school and amounts paid to governors for expenses. • information about school security. • information about the implementation of the governing body's policy on pupils with special educational needs (SEN) and any changes to the policy during the last year. • a description of the arrangements for the admission of pupils with disabilities; details of steps to prevent disabled pupils being treated less favourably than other pupils; and details of existing facilities to assist access to the school by pupils with disabilities. • the accessibility plan covering future policies for increasing access by those with disabilities to the school (from April 2004). • how teachers' professional development impacts on teaching and learning. • number of pupils on roll and rates of pupils' authorised and unauthorised absence. • the school's targets for Key Stage 2/ assessments • National Curriculum assessment results for appropriate Key Stages, with national summary figures.
Instrument of Government	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The name of the school. • The category of the school. • The name of the governing body. • The manner in which the governing body is constituted. • The name of any person entitled to appoint any category of governor. • Details of any trust. • If the school has a religious character, a description of the ethos of the school. • The date the instrument takes effect.

Pupils & Curriculum Policies - this section gives access to information about policies that relate to pupils and the school curriculum.

Class	Description
Home - school agreement	Written statement of the school's aims and values, the school's responsibilities, the parental responsibilities and the school's expectations of its pupils for example homework arrangements.
Curriculum Policy	Statement on following the policy for national curriculum subjects, including any syllabus followed by pupils at the school.
Sex Education Policy	Written statement of policy with regard to sex education.
Collective Worship	Statement of arrangements for the required daily act of collective worship.
Pupil Discipline	Written statement of general principles on behaviour and discipline including any anti bullying policy as appropriate.

School Policies - This section gives access to information about policies that relate to the school in general.

Class	Description
Reports of School Inspections under Sections 10 and 23 of the School Inspections Act 1996	Report of an inspection of the school and the summary of the report.
Post Inspection action plan	A plan setting out the actions required following Ofsted inspection.
Charging and remissions policies	A statement of the school's policy with respect to charges and remission: any optional extra or board and lodging of which charges are permitted, for example music tuition, trips.
School session times	Details of school session and dates of school terms and holidays.
Special Education Needs	Information about the school's policy on providing for pupils with special educational needs.

Accessibility Plans	Written plan of improvements to access for pupils with disabilities (<i>from 2004</i>).
Health and Safety Policy	Written statement of general policy with respect to health and safety at work of employees (and others) and the organisation and arrangements for carrying out the policy.
Child Protection Policy	Statement of general principles on Child Protection arrangements (<i>from March 2004</i>).
Complaints procedure	Statement of procedures for dealing with complaints.
Staff Appraisal	Statement of procedures adopted by the governing body relating to staff appraisal.
Staff Conduct, Discipline and Grievance	Statement of procedure for regulating conduct and discipline of school staff and procedures by which staff may seek redress for grievance.
